In the classroom, active and engaging interaction between staff and students has extremely beneficial impacts on learning and social behaviour.

Student engagement is multidimensional. It includes providing support in an academic setting, participation in team-building activities, persistence in encouraging positive attitudes, emotional assistance and reassurance, and cognitive awareness.

Not only does active and engaging interaction make teaching and learning more fun for staff and students, it stimulates a positive association with the classroom which also encourages regular attendance and compliance with school policies and in turn inspires academic success.

Being part of an active and engaging learning environment also reduces the risk of delinquency, disruptive, and anti-social behaviour.

It has also been proven to be effective in decreasing the number of students who drop out of school each year.

An active and engaging setting also aids teachers in demonstrating effective classroom management by providing



students with a variety of opportunities to respectfully interact with and subsequently stimulate one another, therefore increasing their concentration and allowing them to remain focused on the tasks at hand, even during more difficult lessons, by skilfully eliminating feelings of boredom, frustration, and academic withdrawal.

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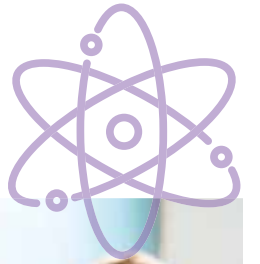

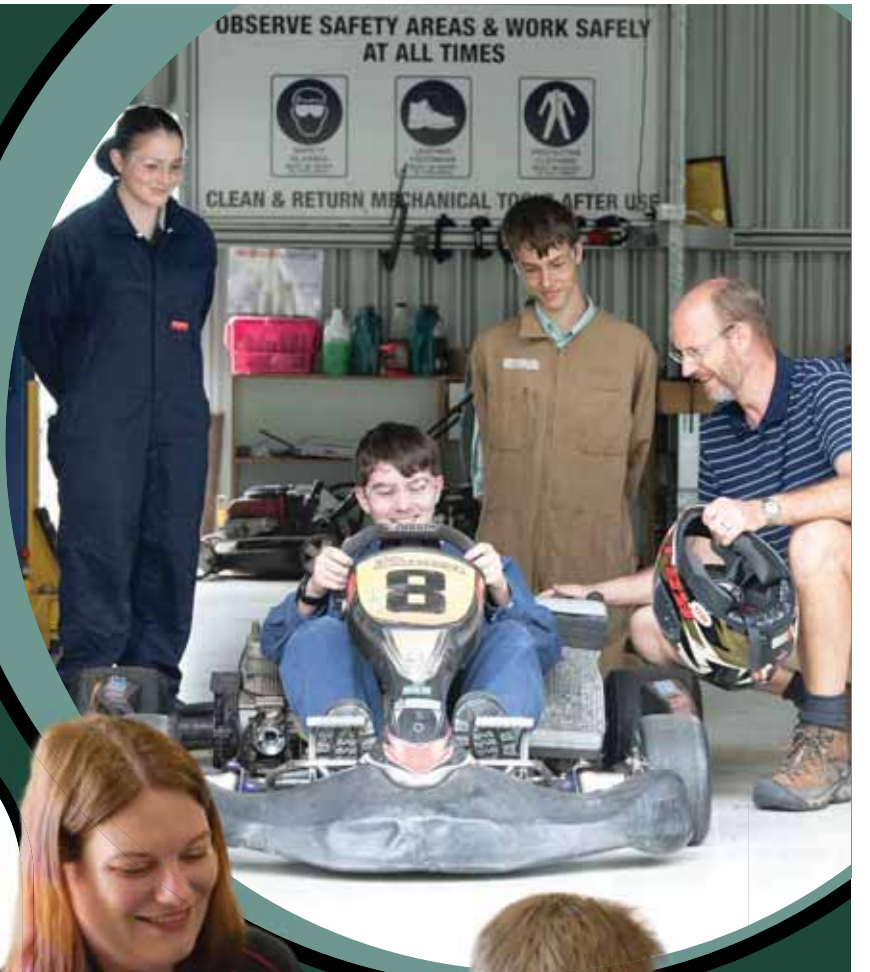
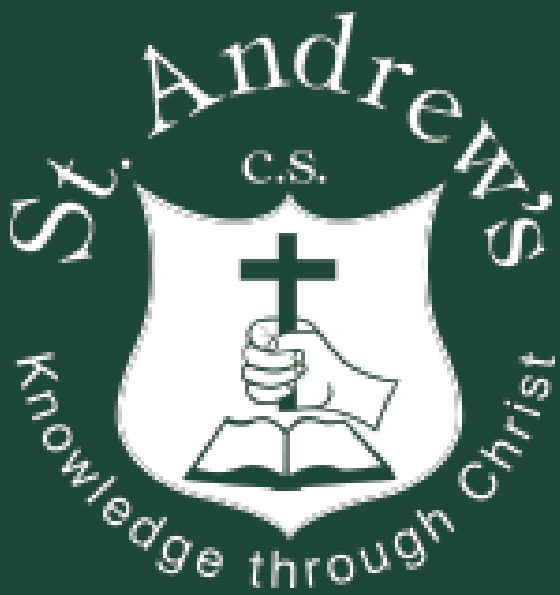

For our special education feature in this edition of the Clarence Valley Independent, we decided to invite parents and guardians to share their definitions of what a good education entails, skills and behaviours they believe children should be taught in the classroom, and the overall quality and standard of Clarence Valley schools.

Madelaine Townsend: As a parent of two children who will be starting school within the next few years, I want them to receive the best possible education. My husband and I are considering moving to Grafton or Yamba this year, so we're starting to look quite closely at a lot of local schools and what their curriculums offer. I've found out through my research that a lot of schools in the Clarence Valley are very inclusive, very focused on student wellbeing and creating safe and supportive learning environments, and they also have strong anti-bullying policies which is very important to me as a parent. I think schools should teach children to be respectful and to value positive relationships with each other and their teachers. I've always been in favour of encouraging children to work together from a young age because it helps them develop their social skills, and it also encourages inclusivity and courtesy.

Judy Ferrars: Three of my grandchildren moved to the Clarence Valley recently and they attend schools in Grafton and South Grafton. Both schools went above and beyond to ensure they were well supported during their transitional weeks, and the staff were amazing. I think we're lucky for a regional area to have such a high standard of schools and teachers. Children need to be shown encouragement and to feel valued in the classroom. To me, a good education is having teachers who are invested in the best interests of their students, they encompass meaningful conversations and support wholesome development by sharing relevant content.

Robyn Kerrigan: A good education has to be affordable, culturally enriching, and respectful. It has to promote a love of learning and it must impart useful knowledge in a mentally stimulating environment. Because it is home to a very diverse community, I think the Clarence Valley has many schools which are well equipped to nurture up and coming generations, and I think there are a lot of educational options available for mums and dads to choose from. Its essential children are taught much more than maths, science, and languages in the classroom. They also need to learn and be rewarded for demonstrating positive behaviours, care and compassion, and respect.

The confidence to undertake a Bachelor degree

Nathan has continued to receive good results and is furthering his studies through an Honours year: "Getting that first grade was the first time that I felt like I can actually do this, and I am really grateful for it."

Nathan is also deepening his

knowledge in psychology through a volunteer position at Lifeline.

"It's a very important job and has been great character building for me, where I'm learning tools in talking to people in general and being able to listen better. I've learnt a lot of great life skills from that."

"I love the calls where you feel like you've made a real difference. They really bring a whole new sense of satisfaction and meaning to life."
